Jason began by working as a zookeeper at Niabi Zoo, in Illinois. As zookeeper, he worked in the frigid temperatures of the 2017-18 Polar Vortex. Temperatures stayed in the -20 degrees.

For the last three summers, Jason has worked for the US Geological Survey as a biological technician, among

other things, conducting research on sylvatic plague, a flea-borne bacterial disease of wild rodents.

Outside of the USGS, Jason has worked with Coastal Raptors, a non-profit organization on the coast of Washington state, which conducts raptor population surveys, trapping, and radio tagging to benefit peregrine falcon and vulture conservation; and assisted with translocating nuisance raptors from SeaTac airport to the Skagit valley.
